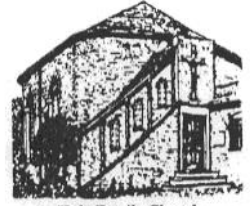

Dear Parishioners,

Due to restrictions imposed on us by the Coronavirus Pandemic there will **NO CHURCH SERVICES** until further notice. This does not mean that we have to "shut up shop", but we will have to be a different sort of Church for the duration of the crisis. We may even learn how to better care for one another in this world where so many people already feel isolated and alone.

**Holy Family Church** will be open during the day, as usual, including 8.00 am on Sunday. Fr Richard has expressed a wish that **St Wulstan's** should be open for at least a short period every day and we are looking at ways in which that can be achieved. For this weekend we will open the Church at our regular service times, as requested by the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales and agreed with Fr Richard. This weekend **St Wulstan's** will be open for **PRIVATE PRAYER** on Saturday 5.30 pm - 6.30 pm, Sunday 10.00 am - 11.00 am and Monday 10.00 am - 10.30 am.

Cardinal Nichols, in his **public letter**, says "...in these emergency circumstances ... the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is removed". Do, please, read the letter from the Cardinal, either by finding it online or picking up a copy from the back of Church when you visit.

If you do come along at these times please be sure to follow **good hygiene practices** and keep a **sensible distance** from other parishioners to reduce the risk of spreading the virus. If you pick up a newsletter or any other information please **take it away** with you; do not leave it lying around for someone else to pick up.

We will attempt to keep everyone up to speed with developments, either by email, via the website or on noticeboards. The internet is a great resource at a time like this. You can click on a **live streamed Mass** or use the resources on the various **Catholic websites** to maintain your prayer life. Some suggestions are included in this newsletter and we will attempt to provide other ideas each week.

If you don't have access to the internet remember there are resources like **Bible Alive** where you can read the scriptures and pray every day if you want to. Church services are also **broadcast on TV**, especially on Sundays. And there is religious content on the **radio**.

Helping each other at this difficult time is part of what it means to belong to the Church and show God's love for one another. **Pick up the phone** and call your friends to check they are okay. Consider setting up a **'Whats App'** group with church friends on your mobiles so you can keep in touch easily and see what everyone else is up to. You can use **Facebook** as well, of course.

Please remember to **pray** for those who are ill and for those who look after them; check on your neighbours or anyone who you know who is incapacitated, and perhaps offer to bring shopping or collect medicines, if required. With every blessing, *Deacon John*

### Two New Auxiliary Bishops Appointed

News to cheer us all up! **Canon Stephen Wright** and **Canon David Evans** have been appointed to be the new Auxiliary Bishops to serve our Archdiocese. This follows Bishop Robert Byrne's appointment to Hexham and Newcastle last March and Bishop David McGough's retirement. Canon David will continue to have pastoral responsibility for the deaneries in Birmingham and Worcestershire (and therefore becomes "our" Bishop) while Canon Stephen will have pastoral responsibility for the deaneries in Staffordshire, Wolverhampton and the Black Country. Some of you will know Canon David as he has said Mass here recently and also came to confirm pupils from St Wulstan's school in January. We wish them both well in their new appointments.
