He has taught at a number of HE institutions, including the University of Edinburgh and the University of St Andrews.

'Was St. Paul a Misogynist?'

Fr. Andrew Robinson is a Roman Catholic priest of the Archdiocese of Liverpool and was ordained in 2003. A former solicitor, Fr Andrew trained for the priesthood in Rome, gaining his degree in theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University. In 2008, he was awarded a Licentiate in Sacred Scripture by the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome. Earlier this year, he was appointed Co-Secretary for the National Methodist-Roman Catholic Dialogue Commission.
