Wrocław European Meeting

The end-of-year European Meeting was held 28 December 2019 - 1 January 2020 in Wrocław, south-west Poland. 13,000 young adults came from outside the city to stay the five days. Everyone was accommodated in families.

Brother Alois introduced the theme for the coming year in Taizé as: "Always on the move, never uprooted." You can read his meditations during the meeting here.

Next year's European Meeting will be held in <u>Turin</u>, Italy, 28 December 2020 - 1 January 2021.

In Wrocław, during the meeting for the small number of UK youth, one young person said, "I don't feel British, I don't want to be British." It was said with a laugh and a shrug of the shoulders, but was nevertheless indicative of what a difficult time it is for our country and the wider world.

In order to face the questions now being pressed upon us, it is so important to have experience of a deep and broad community in Christ, in the Church. As brother Alois says, we need to find a way to be "Always on the move, never uprooted".
