It's great to see members of our Syrian families getting involved in more and more activities. local An exhibition bv the Kidderminster Camera Club in Kidderminster library contains work by 3 Syrian students. If you would like to go along to view the exhibition, it is on until the end of March. We understand that KCC have been very supportive of their new members, who attend weekly and enter competitions, and it is great to know such positive things are taking place.

WFRSG recently held an additional session of the weekly 'Conversation Café' to enable the MP for the Wyre Forest, Mark Garnier, to meet with our Syrian families. This was at Mr Garnier's request and he was accompanied by Councilor Lucy Hodgson, the member of Worcestershire County Council who has responsibility for refugees throughout the county. The session took the usual CC format, with family members sitting with members of the local community who have been helping them to improve their language skills. Mr Garnier and Councilor Hodgson visited each table to chat with individual family members. In a final statement to the gathered audience

both Mr Garnier and Councilor Hodgson assured the families that they could be contacted to help with any additional problems that might arise which could not be dealt with locally. It was good to hear the families express how welcome they had been made, not only by members of the WFRSG, but by the smiling faces of local people and neighbours.
